Ring and Chain Method

Intermediate - Advance

Materials:

Lizbeth Thread any size

Tatting Needle or Two Tatting shuttle

Definitions of Abbreviations

R = Ring (- or p) = picot

Ch = Chain SR or Φ = Split Ring

rw = reverse work cl = Close

(+) = join

Legend

○ Ring

⌒ Chain

— Picot

— Yellow line thread space

■ Round 1 - Purple

■ Round 2 - Blue

■ Round 3 - Green

■ Round 4 - Brown

○ Split Ring - Do Blue First

NOTE: Make all joining picots very, very small.

Head:

R(A): 4-8-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(B): 4+(to last p of R(A))4-4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(C): 4+(to last p of R(B))4-4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(D): 4+(to last p of R(C))4-4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(E): 4+(to last p of R(D))8-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(F): 4+(to last p of R(E))8-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(G): 4+(to last p of R(F))4-4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(H): 4+(to last p of R(G))8-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(I): 4+(to last p of R(H))8-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(J): 4+(to last p of R(I))4-4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R(K): 4+(to last p of R(J))8+(to first P of

1st R(A) made) 4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw Join to where the first R and Ch meet.

Tie/Hide/Cut

Face:

An approx. 45" long piece of thread needed for each part of the face. {*Needle Tatters: Thread & Ring Method using a cut piece of thread.*}

Mouth:

R: 5+(to center p of Head R(D))3-2 Cl

leave a 1/16" thread space

R: 2+(to last p of prev. R)3+(to center p of Head R(C))3-2 Cl leave a 1/16" thread space

R(N): 2+(to last p of prev. R)3+(to center p of Head R(B))5 Cl Tie/Hide/Cut

Nose:

R: 2-4+(to 1st mouth space made) 2+(to base of 2nd R of mouth)2+(to last mouth space made)2 Cl

Tie/Hide/Cut

Eyes:

R: 8+(to center p of Head R(G))8 Cl + to picot on nose

R: 8+(to center p of Head R(J))8 Cl Tie/Hide/Cut

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Body:

Round 1:

R: 8-8 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2-2 rw

*R: 8+(to p of prev. R)8 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2-2 rw*

Repeat three more times for a total of 5 R's and Ch's
Join to where the first R and Ch meet. Tie/Hide/Cut

Round 2:

R: 4-4+(to first p of any Ch of Round 1)4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

**R: 4+(to last p of prev R)4+(to third p of same Ch of Round 1)4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R: 4+(to last p of prev R)4+(to last p of same Ch of Round 1)4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R: 4+(to last p of prev R)4+(to first p of next Ch of Round 1)4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw**

Repeat ** to ** three more times

for a total of 13 R's & Ch's

R: 4+(to last p of prev R)4+(to third p of same Ch of Round 1)4-4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

R: 4+(to last p of prev R)4+(to last p of same Ch of Round 1)4 + (to first P of first R made) 4 Cl rw

Ch: 2-2-2-2-2 rw

Join to where the first R and Ch meet. Tie/Hide/Cut

Hat:

Row 1:

R: 16 Cl

SR: 4-4 Φ 8 Cl

SR: 4-4 Φ 8 Cl

SR: 4-4 Φ 8 Cl

R: 16 Cl Tie/Hide/Cut

Row 2:

R: 4+(to p on second R made)8-4 Cl Rw

SR: 4+(to p on corresponding R)4 Φ 4-4 Cl

R: 4+(to p on corresponding R)8-4 Cl

Tie/Hide/Cut

Row 3:

R: 4+(to p on corresponding R)12 Cl Rw

SR: 4+(to p on corresponding R)4 Φ 8 Cl

R: 4+(to p on corresponding R)12 Cl

Tie/Hide/Cut

Scarf:

This is one long, continuous chain.

Ch: 5 Ds, 16 p's separated by 5 double stitches

{Needle Tatters: Do to the length of the chain take the double stitches off the needle as needed, snug tight and continue the long chain. Do not tie a knot.}

Ch: 10 + (to last P of Ch made)

{Needle Tatters: Take the double stitches, snug tight, join and continue.}

Ch: 5 + (to corresponding p on Ch)

{Needle Tatters: Take the double stitches, snug tight, join and continue.}

Repeat the last Ch 14 more times.

Ch: 5 Join to the first Ch made Tie/Hide/Cut

Finishing:

The head, body, and hat are sewn together. The scarf is tied around the neck.
